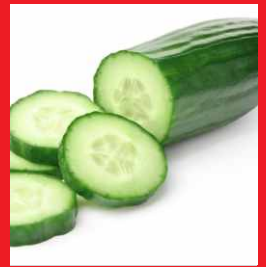

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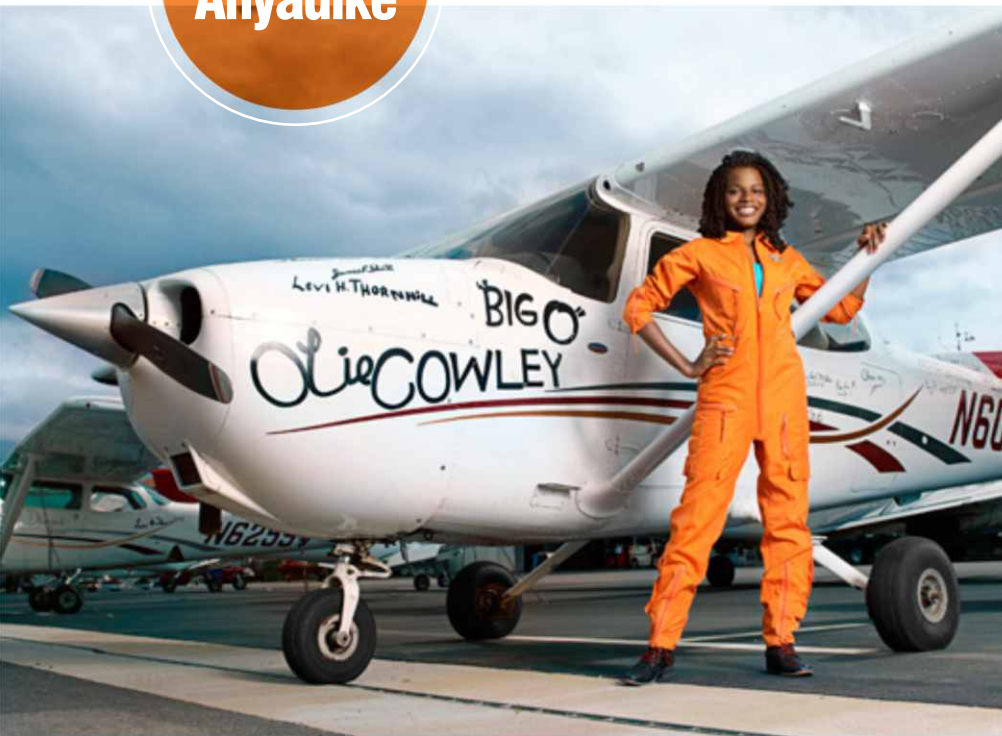

Kimberly Anyadike



Born to Nigerian parents, Kimberly Anyadike at the age of 15, in 2009, became the youngest African-American female pilot to ever fly across the United States, a journey that took a total of thirteen days. Anyadike learned to fly at age 12 through the Compton-based Tomorrow's Aeronautical Museum, which offers aviation lessons in an after-school program for disadvantaged youths.

The brave teenager came up with the idea for the trip on her own; Anyadike washed airplanes and did other odd jobs and tasks to earn "museum dollars" that she traded in for flight lessons. "I wanted to inspire other kids to really believe in themselves," Anyadike said.

Anyadike hopes to fly around the world someday – but as a doctor, treating patients in disaster and war zones while working with *Doctors Without Borders*. What will you be remembered for?

Richard Turere

Richard Turere, 13, doesn't like lions. In fact, he hates them. Yet this bright Maasai boy has devised an innovative solution that's helping the survival of these magnificent beasts -- by keeping them away from humans.

Living on the edge of Nairobi National Park, in Kenya, Turere first became responsible for herding and safeguarding his family's cattle when he was just nine. But often, his valuable livestock would be raided by the lions roaming the park's sweet savannah grasses, leaving him to count the losses. So, at the age of 11, Turere decided it was time to find a way of protecting his family's cows, goats and sheep from falling prey to hungry lions.

His light bulb moment came with one small observation. "One day, when I was walking around," he says, "I discovered that the lions were scared of the moving light." Turere realized that lions were afraid of venturing near the farm's stockade when someone was walking around with a flashlight. He put his young mind to work and a few weeks later he'd come up with an innovative, simple and low-cost system to scare the predators away.

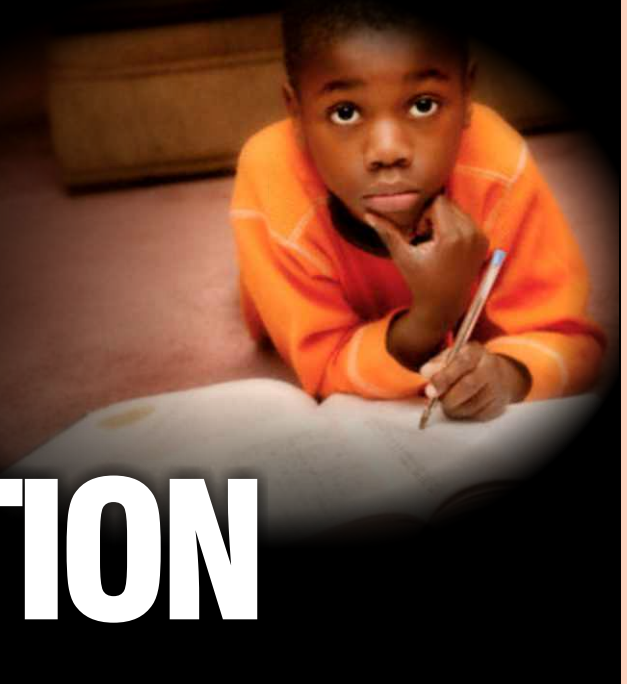
He fitted a series of flashing LED bulbs onto poles around the livestock enclosure, facing outward. The lights were wired to a box with switches and to an old car battery powered by a solar panel. They were designed to flicker on and off intermittently, thus tricking the lions into believing that someone was moving around carrying a flashlight.

And it worked. Since Turere rigged up his "Lion Lights," his family has not lost any livestock to the wild beasts, to the great delight of his father and astonishment of his neighbors. What's even more impressive is that Turere devised and installed the whole system by himself, without ever receiving any training in electronics or engineering.

The 13-year-old's remarkable ingenuity has been recognized with an invitation to the TED 2013 Conference, in California where he shared the stage with some of the world's greatest thinkers, innovators and scientists.

The difference between a dog of five hundred thousand naira and a cheap or free dog is preparation. Does your preparation match your desire for greatness? To be a global player you have

to pay a global price. Nothing less.

Invest in yourself, spend time to develop your gifts and talents. Spend time to expand your vision. Warren Buffet, regarded as the world's greatest investor, was asked, 'Mr. Buffet, where should a person invest their money today?' And without hesitating he said 'In themselves, in becoming better.' You need to invest in yourself in order to get better at what it is you are doing. People who don't invest in themselves are people who don't believe in themselves and if you don't believe in yourself you have no future and nobody will want to invest in you.

Prepare! Read books, attend training programs, listen and watch anointed and inspirational materials. Spend time thinking. Ask questions. Grow! Stop chasing money, chase value. Become more valuable and you will attract money. Stop chasing opportunities become valuable and opportunities will open up for you. The law of preparation states that success occurs where preparation meets opportunity. It is better to be prepared for an opportunity and not have one than to have an opportunity and not be prepared for it. I love this quote from Benjamin Disraeli, Britain's first Jewish Prime Minister, 'The secret of success is for a man to be ready for his time when it comes.'

God has great plans for you but those plans will not fulfill themselves. You have to prepare and position yourself for them to be fulfilled. Your responsibility is to prepare, God's responsibility is to bring the opportunities. God is committed to doing His part as long as you have done yours. It is time to settle down and prepare for the future you have been praying for.

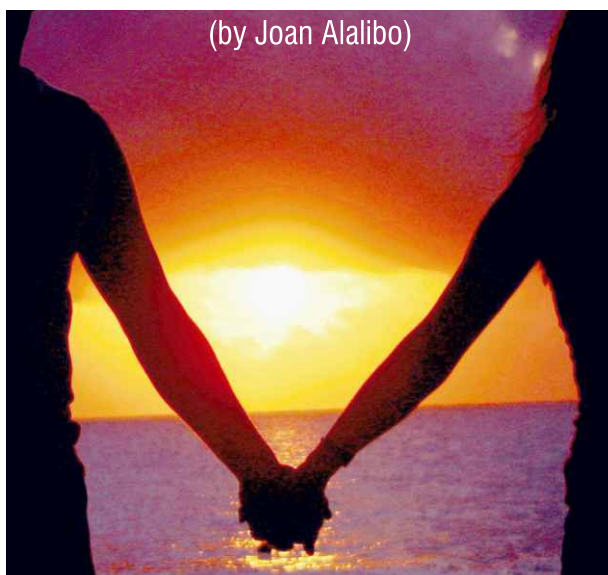

ordinarily will not do. From these two groups run away. Do not tolerate them unless you have decided to live in continual bitterness.

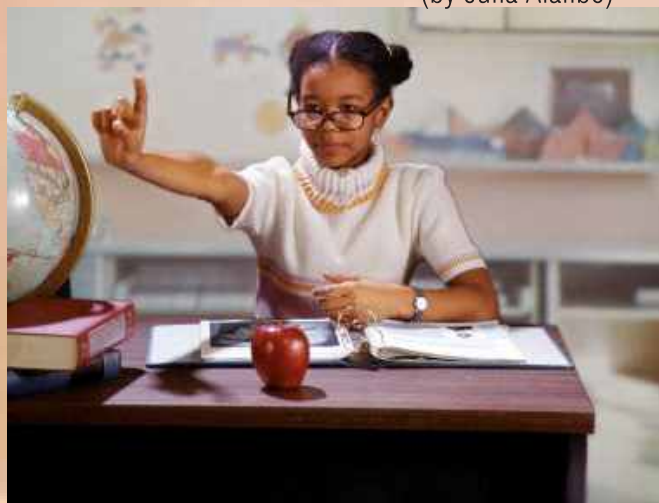

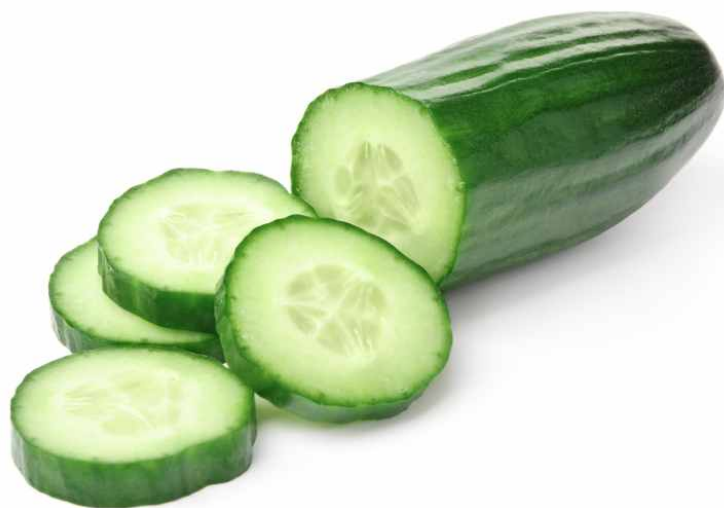


5 IMPORTANT THINGS TO ALWAYS TAKE CARE OF?

THE MINDSET OF A CHAMPION

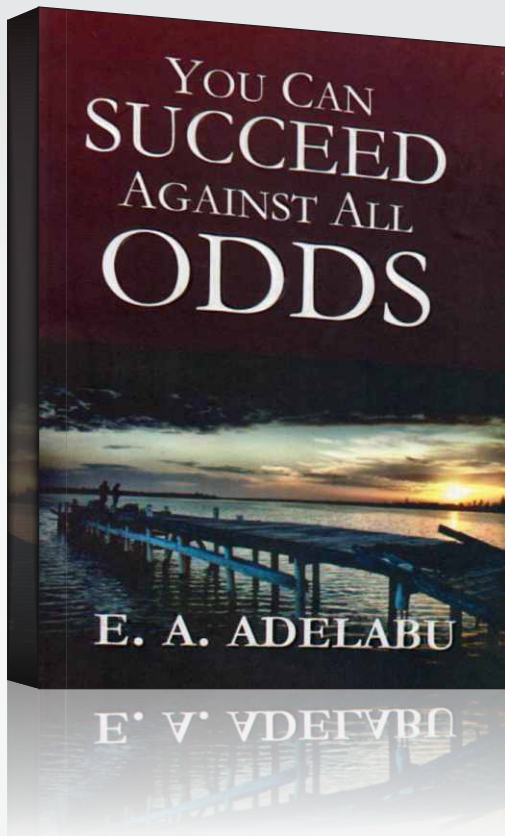

PIZZA

INGREDIENTS

Flour, Ketchup, Yeast , Red chili flakes, Sugar , Rosemary , Salt, Oregano ,Oil /onion, Warm water, Tomatoes, Minced beef , Ginger/ garlic paste , Yogurt, Pizza cheese, Olives/ sausages (sliced).

METHOD

For dough: Mix yeast in warm water and let it rise for 5minutes. Mix in sugar and salt. Add the mixture to flour, add oil, knead it very well, cover and leave it in a warm place. After it rises, knead it again. Let it rest.

For sauce: Peel the tomato skin and blend. Heat a pan; add ketchup, tomato, salt, red chili flakes, oregano and rosemary. Cook till it thickens.

For topping: Cook mince in pan till dry, then you add oil, ginger/garlic paste. Sauté. Add salt pepper and yogurt.

PREPARATION

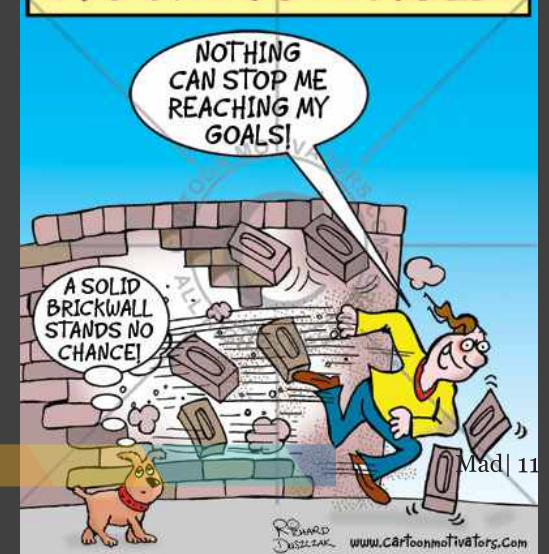
Divide the dough into 4 parts (it will make four large pizzas)

Roll dough on greased pizza pansh (circular)

Apply tomato sauce round it, sprinkle crushed onion, pizza cheese, mince and sliced sausages capsicum and olives.

Bake the prepared pizza on a high heated oven for about 15-17 minutes until done. Serve hot.
